	Animal Complaint	Woodland	2020-05-01	RP called to report a raccoon had run passed her in the middle of the day. Officer arrived and was advised the raccoon had climbed over the fence and was now gone. Officer looked for the raccoon but could not find it. RP advised to call again.
	Trespassing	Woodland	2020-05-02	A Woodland resident called to report that a female with a dog used their dock by walking through their property before boarding a boat after disregarding requests to leave.
	Road Debris	Woodland	2020-05-04	An officer removed a small tree from the roadway.
	911 Hang-up	Woodland	2020-05-10	An officer received a 911 hang-up call that came back near a residence in Woodland. Officer checked the area and found nothing. The officer attempted to call the number several times with no results, no one answered at the home.
	Gas Odor	Woodland	2020-05-11	CSO was dispatched to the listed address for a hit

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				gas line. CSO blocked the driveway while Wayzata Fire checked the leak. CenterPoint Energy arrived on scene and was able to repair the gas line.
	Traffic Stop - Citation	Woodland	2020-05-11	Citation - No insurance- On routine patrol I observed a vehicle with no headlight traveling north on County Road 101. I stopped the vehicle and spoke to the driver who said he did not have insurance in the vehicle. The driver said he bought the vehicle on Saturday, 2 days prior and had been driving with no insurance for 2 days. I cited the driver for no insurance and had him drive to the Grays bay boat launch which was approx .25 of a mile away. The driver said he understood and drove to the boat access. I followed and sat in the area for a few minutes to make sure he did not drive.
	Fire Alarm - Residential	Woodland	2020-05-13	Officer dispatched to a residential fire alarm. Officer checked residence and found a construction company on scene that set off alarm, false trip. Fire Department notified and canceled.
	Animal Complaint - Injured Deer	Woodland	2020-05-13	RP called to report a deer with a broken leg on the property he maintains. Officer arrived and found the deer able to move and run away. Officer advised that nature would have to run its course.
	Ordinance Violation - Illegal Signage	Woodland	2020-05-16	CSO removed an Expert Asphalt sign from the right of way and placed it behind the salt shed.
	Tree Down	Woodland	2020-05-17	An officer was dispatched to a tree down in wires, blocking in Woodland. Xcel Energy removed the lines and restored power and Shorewood Tree removed the tree.
	Wire Down	Woodland	2020-05-17	CSO was dispatched to a wire down at the listed address. A tree had fallen, taking down an electrical pole and causing the transformer to explode. Xcel and Wayzata Fire responded to handle the issue. RP reported that both sides of Gale Rd were without power.
	Ordinance Violation - Illegal Signage	Woodland	2020-05-18	CSO removed a sign from the right of way and placed it behind the salt shed.
	Alarm - Residential	Woodland	2020-05-25	Officer was dispatched to a residential alarm. Officer arrived on scene and searched the perimeter of the residence. While Officer was searching the perimeter, Officer observed an SUV pull up partially into the driveway and turn around. Due to the

				location of the incident and time of day, Officer believed this was suspicious and requested additional help. Wayzata Police Department and Minnetonka Police Department assisted. Officers searched the area and found nothing suspicious.
