INCIDENT	INCIDENT DATE	INCIDENT DETAILS:
Fire Alarm - Residential	2022-01-06	Officer dispatched to a residential fire alarm. Officer was canceled before arrival.
Alarm - Residential - Cancelled	2022-01-11	Officer was dispatched to a residential burglary alarm. As officer was enroute to the scene, dispatch stated there was proper code to cancel.
Identity Theft	2022-01-17	Officer was dispatched a phone call request regarding identity theft. RP received a notification via mail from MN Unemployment Insurance that his application was received. RP did not apply for unemployment and reported the issue to MN Unemployment Insurance.
Suspicious Activity - DAC- IPS - Arrest	2022-01-17	An officer observed a suspicious vehicle in Woodland on County Road 101 which eventually pulled into a dark home in Minnetonka, the officer made contact with the driver after believing the driver was attempting to evade the officer. A resident of Apple Valley was arrested and booked into the Hennepin County Adult Detention Center for driving after cancellation, inimical to public safety.

House Check - Information	2022-01-28	RP called requesting a house check.
Ordinance Violation - Snowmobile	2022-01-29	RP called to report some snowmobiles had driven on the fire lane adjoining his property. Officer advised he would try to locate where the snowmobiles came from. While enroute a second phone call was dispatched from the other involved party. Officer advised no snowmobile travel in/on the Fire Lane and no use on City streets other than shortest distance to and from the lake. The involved party apologized and said he would not do it again.
